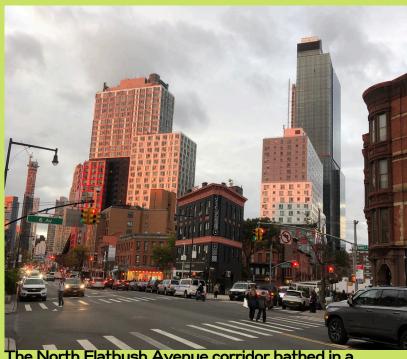
Let's continue to engage, share ideas, and support each other. Let's shop blackowned, shop women-owned, and shop as local as possible.

Improve and maintain the quality of the streetscape.

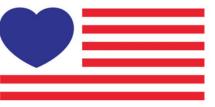
Enhance the visitor/resident/merchant experience.
